The 67 Florida Superintendents asked that the 2014-2015 school grades not be released due to concerns with the 2015 Florida Standards Assessment. These grades are for information purposes only. It is important to understand that learning gains were not included in the 2015 calculations and the 2016 school grades will use a different formula. Therefore, the school grades that will be released in summer of 2016 cannot be compared to 2015 school grades.



Extended Day and Pre-K

- ◆ All Seminole County Elementary Schools offer an extended day program that provides after school care. Some even offer before school care. Extended day enrichment programs are also offered such as karate, golf, cheerleading, basketball, dance, etc.
- ◆ Pre-Kindergarten programs offer both full-day and half-day programs. The VPK program is aligned to the 2011 Florida Early Learning and Developmental Standards for four-year-olds and provides 540 hours of instruction during the school year or 300 hours during the summer.




